## The Organ Problem

The organ in the church was built in 1959 by the firm N. P. Mander, using older pipework from a previous instrument. Over the last couple of months the organ has become increasingly unreliable and the day is fast approaching that the instrument will simply stop 'speaking'.

The organ has not been overhauled during the last 58 years and a major upgrade is required to allow the organ to function reliably and continue to play its crucial role in the worshipping life of the church. The organ is running on the original old cotton covered wiring and, in the view of two local organ builders who have inspected the instrument during the past two years, it is remarkable that the instrument still works!

The actual organ is in reasonably good condition, apart from acquiring 58 years' worth of dust and some of the operating parts would benefit from being upgraded to further improve reliability.

## The Great Organ Fix

The work could be carried out in stages depending upon the success of the fundraising:

Phase 1 – Replacing old wiring and full upgrade of console. **This is Essential to preserve a working instrument.**

Phase 2 – Cleaning of all current pipework, replacement of some operating parts, installing pipework into vacant slides on Swell Organ and enhancing Pedal Organ

Phase 3 – Installing a new unit chest organ in the Chancel to create Choir Organ.

The total funds required to cover the work outlined in all three phases is £55,000.
